

Klondyke / Sunset Area The Cloud

The morning of December 22, 1962, Brother Branham had a vision in which he was about 40 miles northeast of Tucson, picking a cocklebur off his trouser leg, when he heard an explosion and saw seven angels. This vision troubled him. Since he felt that no one could have survived such an explosion, he thought the Lord might be showing him that he would be killed in an explosion of some type. After moving to Tucson the beginning of 1963, he went to Sabino Canyon where he continued to pray more about this. While standing on what we now call "Sword Mountain," a sword appeared in his hand. He was told it was "The King's Sword." The Lord then assured him that this vision of the angels did not mean his death, but it had to do with his ministry. In March 1963, while hunting javelina in the Klondyke / Sunset area in Arizona, this vision of the angels was fulfilled.

It was about eight o'clock in the morning. I'd folded my legs and was picking some of them goat-heads off my overalls. I said, "You know, look at here, isn't that strange. This is exactly—and I'm perfectly in the position. I'm east of Flagstaff, northeast of Tucson. Here's these goat-heads that I said I'd be picking off of my trouser. That's strange," and I just threw it down.

I looked up, on the side across the great chasm, and there was a whole herd [of javelina]. They were almost in shooting distance. I wouldn't shoot them myself, because I didn't want them. I said, "If I can just get to Brother Fred and them, and get them over there." I ran over a little ravine and along a ledge, and as I was running along there, all of a sudden it sounded like the whole country come apart, with such a blast. It scared me. I was wearing a big black hat—and that just looks like a javelina—I thought somebody had shot me. It just scared me till I jumped up in the air. Just then I thought, "What is this all about?"

I saw rocks weighing fifty to sixty pounds tumbling off the side of the hill, rolling down. I looked up, there was that white circle above me there, circling around. Here come seven angels, come moving down out of the air, picked me up, and said, "Go back to your home to the East, right away, and bring those Seven Seals where there's seven mysteries, for the complete Word is revealed now in these seven mysteries."

If you ever believed I ever said anything in a sermon inspired, you take them tapes of the Seven Seals. If you ever heard anything that's really, as I can say it's "thus saith the Lord," get those.

After Brother Branham saw the *Life* magazine photo of the cloud, he made these remarks:

When I come, one thing, was by a vision, that I was standing above Tucson up here when a blast went off. Brother Fred was there when it went off. And they took that picture, you know, in the sky. And I didn't think much about it, never noticed it. So it begin to impress me somehow the other day. And Brother Norman, Norma's father here, told me, said, "Did you notice this?"

And just as I looked, right there was them angels just as plain as they could be, setting right there in that picture. You see? I looked to see when it was, and it was time, same 'bout day or two before, or day or two after I was up there. I looked where it was at: northeast of Flagstaff, or Prescott, which is below Flagstaff. Well, that's just where we was at (See?), just exactly.

Twenty-six miles high, why, vapor can't go for over four miles high, or five, moisture, any kind of fog or anything. You see? Planes fly at nineteen thousand, that's to get up above all the clouds. You see? And nineteen thousand is about four miles high. This is twenty-six miles high and thirty miles across it and in the shape of the pyramid, if you've looked at the picture.

Klondyke / Sunset Area Where the whirlwind came down - #1

The two black stripes, seen in the photo on the left, can also be seen in the aerial photo below. The photo below shows the area where Brother Branham camped when he went hunting for javelina, near Klondyke, Arizona.

In 1964, while camping here, Brother Branham was shoveling dirt onto the campfire, when a whirlwind came over this bluff in three blasts. It came just above him. At that time, the Lord told him, "Judgment Striking West Coast."

A few days after this, Alaska had a 9.2 magnitude earthquake on Good Friday, March 28, 1964. This is the second largest earthquake recorded in the world.

When the whirlwind came over the bluff, it blasted the rock away from the area around the two black stripes. The area with the white cross (to the left of the black stripes), was blasted away when the whirlwind hit. Many of those chunks of rock are three-cornered, like the shape of a pyramid. The tops of the trees were also cut off by the whirlwind.

When the whirlwind came over the bluff, Brother Branham was standing near the campfire location that is behind him in the photo on the left.




(Notice that the campfire location in that photo is different than the campfire location in the other two photos. When Brother Branham camped here, the campfire was against the rock that is seen directly underneath Brother Green's left arm in the lower left photo.)

When the whirlwind came over the bluff, it blasted the rock away from the area around the two black stripes and the white cross. The three-cornered rocks can still be found in this area. The tops of the trees were also cut off by the whirlwind. In the photo above, you can see that the trees are still shorter than the other trees.

Klondyke / Sunset Profile

In 1969, we made the discovery that out on the left end of the campsite bluff, there is this profile of Brother Branham's forehead, eyes, nose, mouth, and chin.



Comparing it to the Pillar of Fire photo taken in Houston, Texas, the profile of Brother Branham's face can be seen.


How many thousands of years did it take the wind, rain, weather, and everything else, to carve that profile on the end of that particular bluff? The direction the profile is facing is towards the place where the seven angels came to Brother Branham. I don't think that is a coincidence.





Klondyke / Sunset Profile

The photo on the lower left shows the height of the profile compared to the height of people.

The photo on the lower right is looking back at the campsite area from the area where the seven angels met Brother Branham in March 1963.




In the photo on the lower right, the location of the profile is along the section that juts out and is about 1/3 of the way into the photograph from the left-hand side.
